

## Requirements and Guidelines for ICPM5 Abstract

The abstract should be **in English** and within **one-page limit**. Please follow the format and style described in this template.

Please use A4 (210 mm x 297 mm) paper size. The abstract should not exceed one A4 page, including figures, with page margins of 25 mm all around. Use font type Times New Roman with single spaced lines [1] [2].

The title (14 points, bold, centered) is followed by one blank line. A blank line should also separate the lists of authors' names (12 points, centered) and their affiliations (12 points, italic, centered). The presenting author's name should be underlined. The email address of the corresponding author should be placed in a separate row below the affiliations.

Each paragraph should be separated by one blank line without any indentation. Body text (12 point) should be justified at both ends (i.e., do not use a ragged-right style).

Figures should be placed before the references [3] and centered. The figure caption follows the style below.

References should be indicated in the text in brackets and listed at the end of the paper (12 points).

The submission of your abstract in Acrobat pdf format with all fonts embedded must be made via the internet site <http://icpm5.plasmabio.com/> before **December 20, 2013**.

Acknowledgments may be placed in a separate paragraph at the end of the text before the references.
